Objectives:

- 2. To educate participants about the various criteria outlined by NAAC for accreditation.
- 3. To assist participants in preparing comprehensive and evidence-based documentation for accreditation
- 4. To introduce participants to the concept of outcome mapping and its relevance in the accreditation process.
- 5. To empower participants with the knowledge and skills necessary to contribute effectively to the accreditation process within their institution.
- 6. To facilitate networking opportunities among participants from different institutions undergoing the accreditation process.
- 7. To establish a support network for ongoing collaboration and sharing of resources beyond the training sessions.
- 8. To equip participants with the tools and knowledge necessary to maintain documentation standards and uphold institutional quality over time.

d. Institutional Support for NAAC and SAAC Preparation:
